URBAN RETREAT

Inaugurated in 2019 along what locals refer to as Via del Pane, or “bread street”, for the numerous bakeries that line it (Panarello especially), these private rooms and suites are not part of a hotel or residence, but what is known in Italy as a *foresteria*, providing short- and medium-term accommodation for travellers.

Spanning five floors, with the vast Argentine restaurant El Porteno on the ground floor, the twenty or so accommodations are owned by Paolo Cattoni — also the boss at wine bar Il Dilettante, on Via San Marco in Brera.

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
